AUTHORITIES FEAR SMALLPOX VACCINE

OCTOBER 9. When a very mainstream medical organization makes an official policy statement AGAINST the use of a drug or vaccine, you know something extremely serious is going on.

That's what has happened. The American Academy of Pediatrics has stated that smallpox vaccinations should not be given before a biowar smallpox attack occurs. The risks are too severe. **THE VACCINES HAVE NOT BEEN TESTED ON CHILDREN.**

And children in general, the Academy says, may incur more adverse effects from the vaccine than adults.

The Academy policy statement was written by Dr. Julia McMillan, pediatrics professor at Johns Hopkins Med School. McMillan says, "We're talking about a disease [smallpox] that hasn't existed in the world since the 1970s and a vaccine that we know can cause death."

Now **THAT'S** a strong statement from a mainstream source. McMillan is also implying that we have no credible evidence out in the open that a biowar smallpox attack will occur.
